## **REGULAR MEETING OF THURSDAY, JUNE 23, 2022 at 9:30 a.m.**

This meeting will be held in person at the Ronald H. Born Auditorium at 170 Otis, San Francisco, CA 94103. The Born auditorium is open to the public as of March 7, 2022. As authorized by California Government Code Section 54953(e) and Mayor London Breed's 45th Supplement to her February 25, 2020 emergency proclamation, some members of the Human Services Commission and participants from the Department of Benefits and Family Support staff may attend this meeting remotely.
