### FY 15/16 Enrollment Trends

Prepared March 2017

Per the request of the Dignity Fund Oversight and Advisory Committee, this document contains analysis of Office on the Aging (OOA) enrollment trends and citywide population data for seniors and adults with disabilities. The OOA enrollment trends are based on FY 15/16 enrollment.

While this overview provides insight into service trends, it is not a formal equity analysis and should not be interpreted as such. As outlined by the Proposition I legislation, the Community Needs Assessment to be completed in FY 17/18 will include equity analysis.

#### Notes on Methodology and Data Source

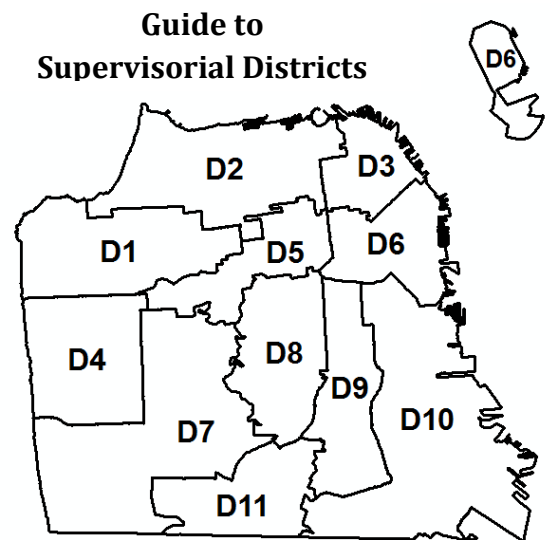
Geographic analysis is primarily based on the home addresses of clients served. This trend is depicted in **green**. If a client's location was not available or could not be mapped to a San Francisco address, it was identified as "Unknown."

For services that are provided only at service sites (e.g., Community Service Centers), two enrollment trends are provided:

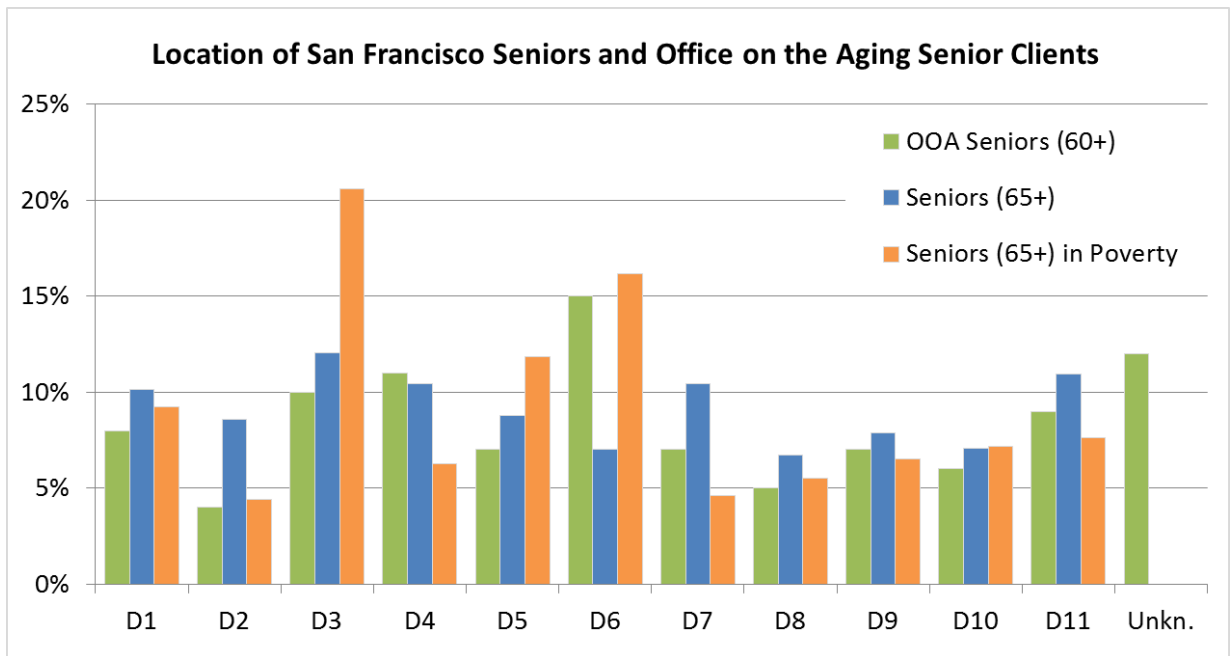
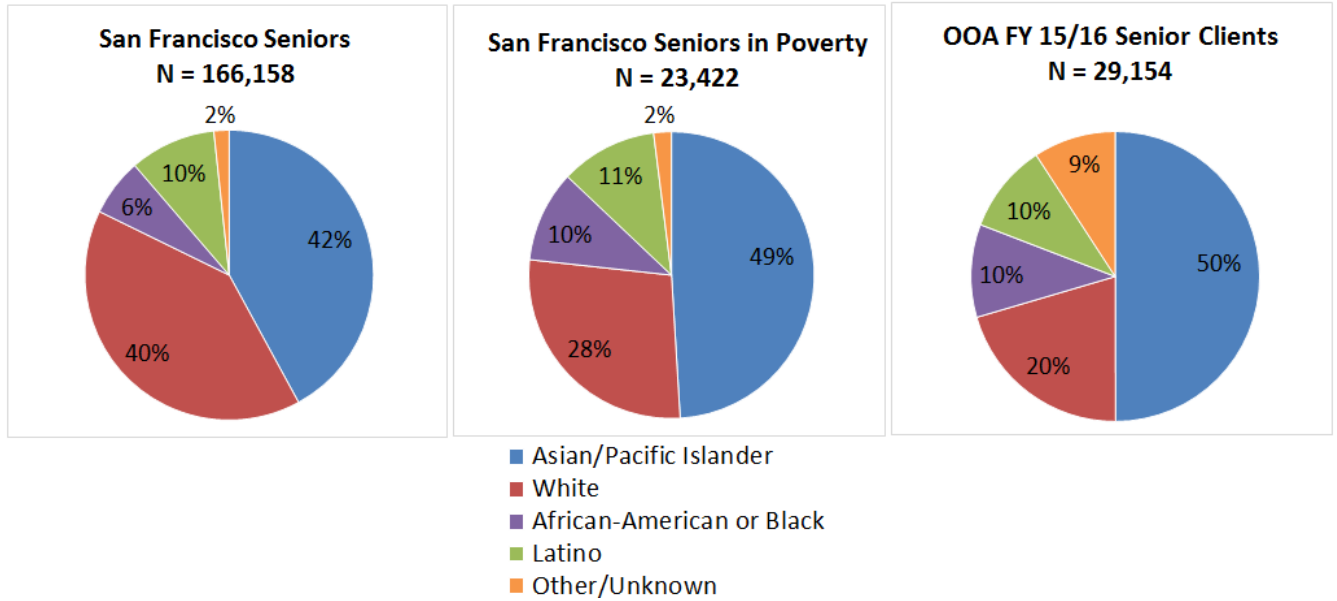
- **Clients' home district**
- **Total enrollments in each district based on the service site location**

Data sources:

- *Client data*: CA GetCare database. This is the primary OOA program database that is used by community providers to track and manage client enrollment.
- *Citywide population data*:
  - Location: American Community Survey 2013 5-Year Estimates available through U.S. Census Bureau American FactFinder (note that data that allows for analysis by specific location typically uses age 65 as the "senior" threshold)
  - Race/Ethnicity: American Community Survey 2014 5-Year Estimates available through the University of Minneapolis Integrated Public Use Microdata Series (IPUMS) datasets
  - Poverty definition: Calculated by the U.S. Census – see [Federal Poverty Threshold](#) for more information

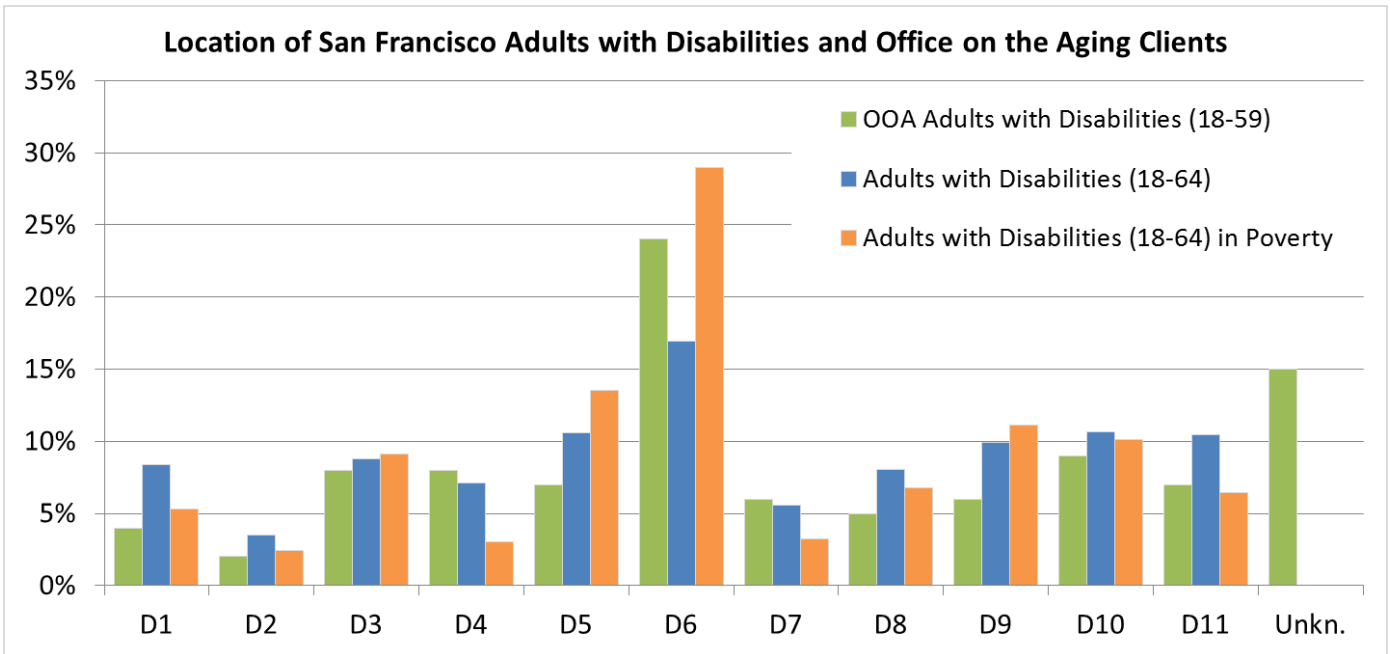
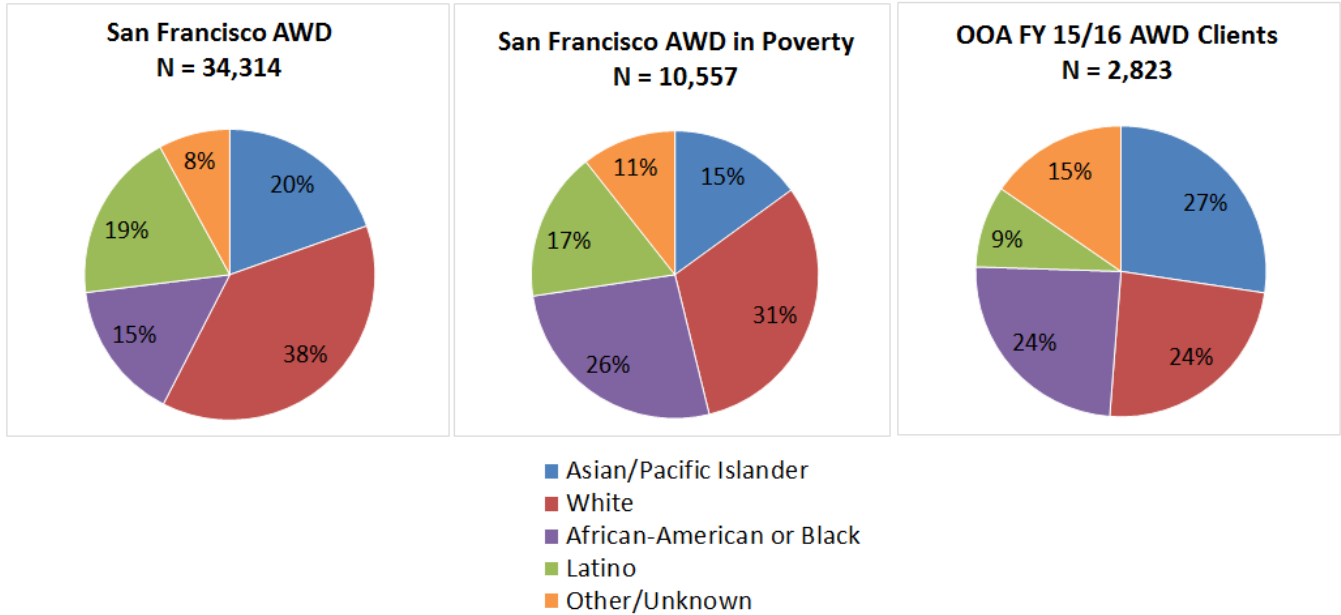

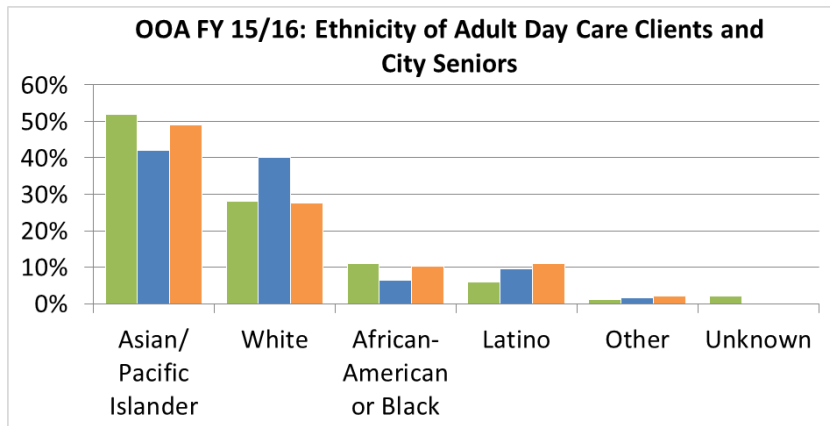

## CONGREGATE MEALS: SENIORS (AGE 60+)



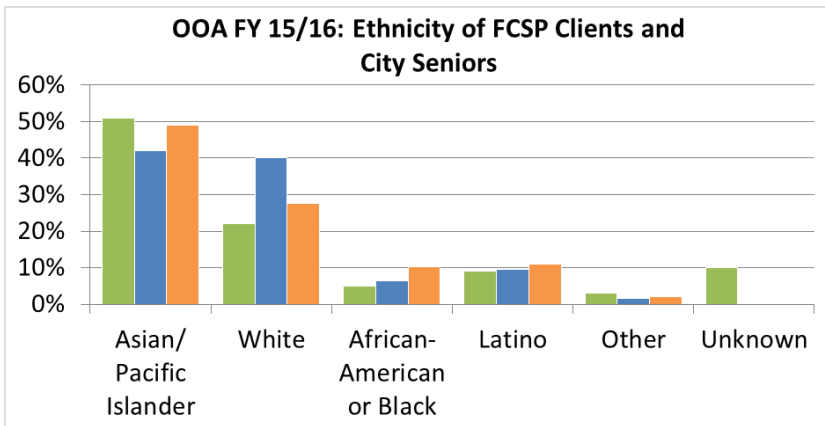
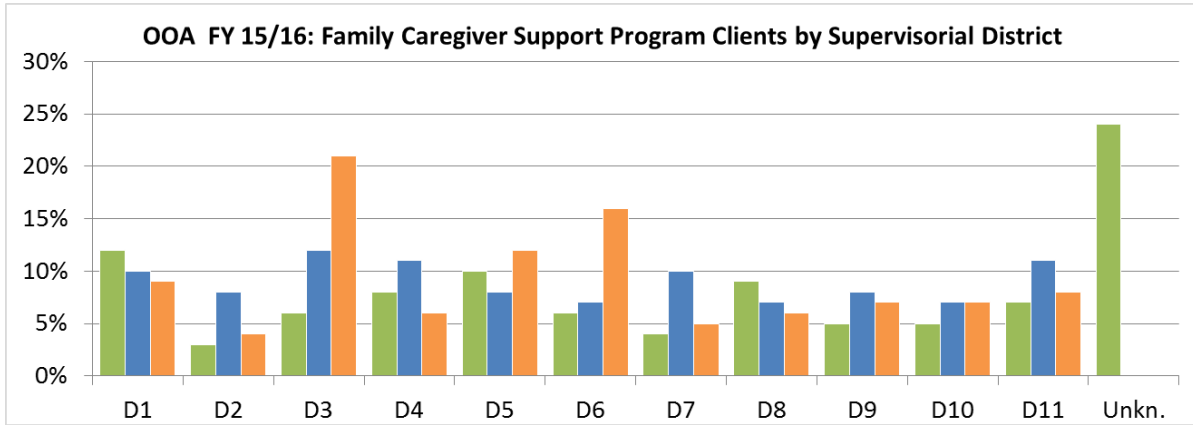

## CONGREGATE MEALS: ADULTS WITH DISABILITIES (AGE 18-59)



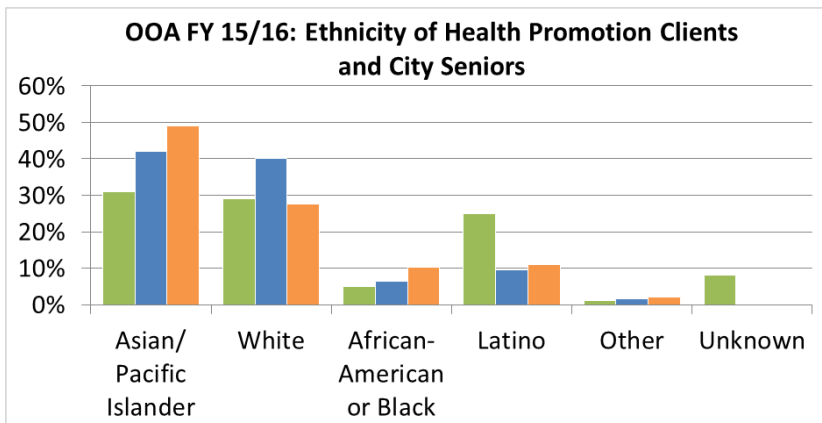
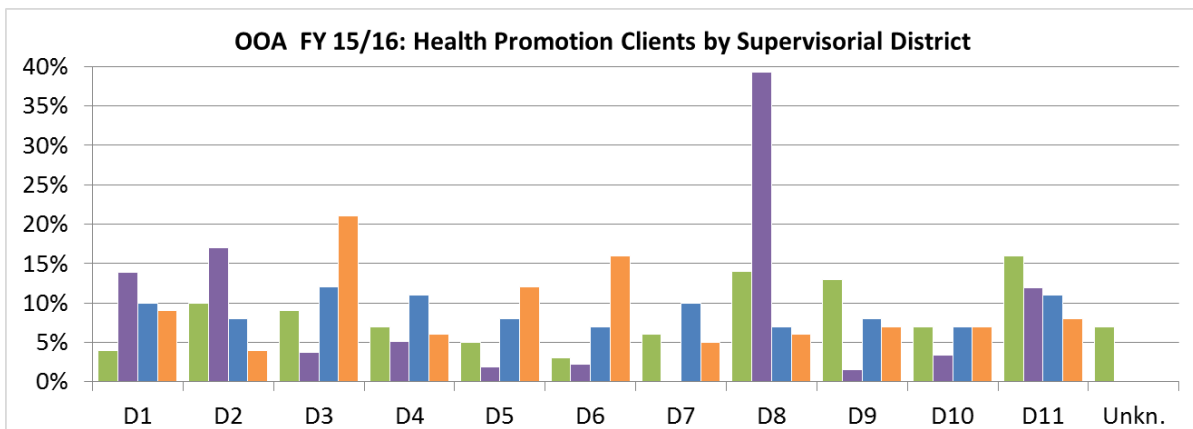

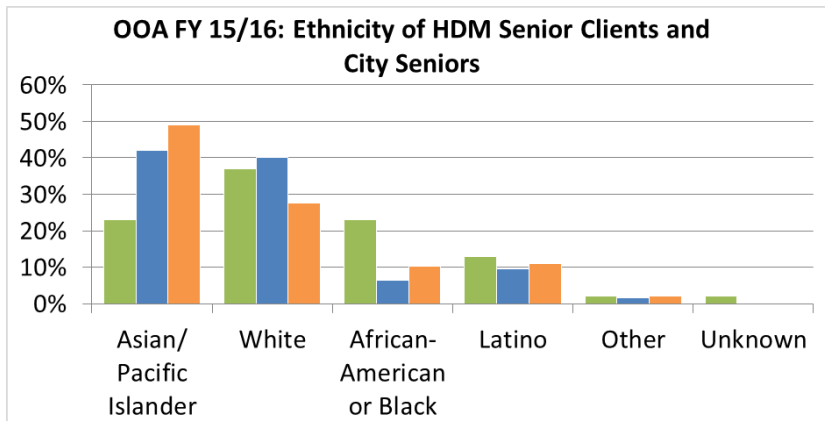
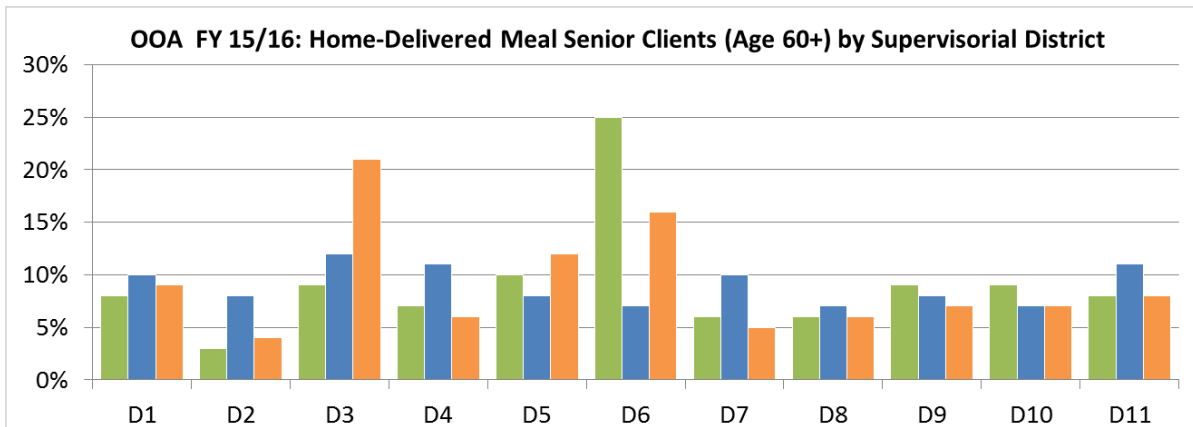
## HOME-DELIVERED GROCERY AND FOOD PANTRY

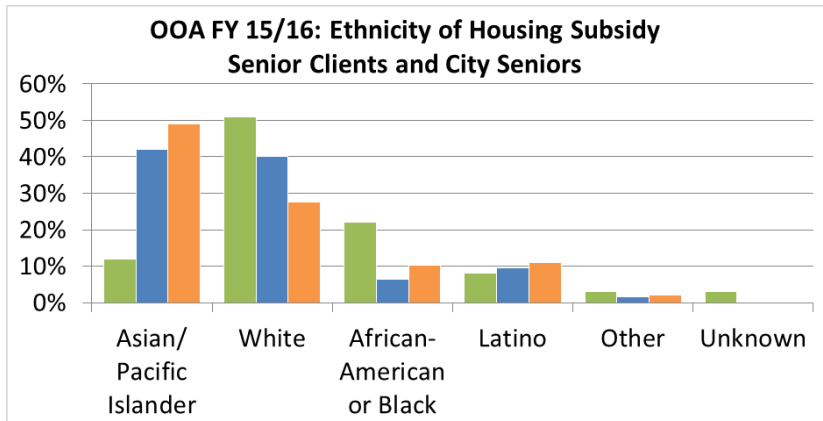
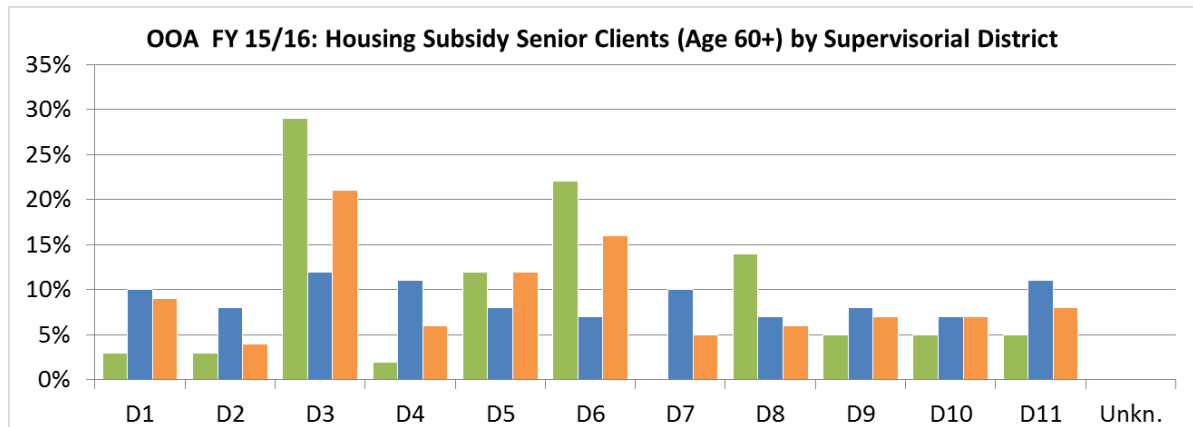


## HOME- DELIVERED MEALS: ADULTS WITH DISABILITIES (18-59)



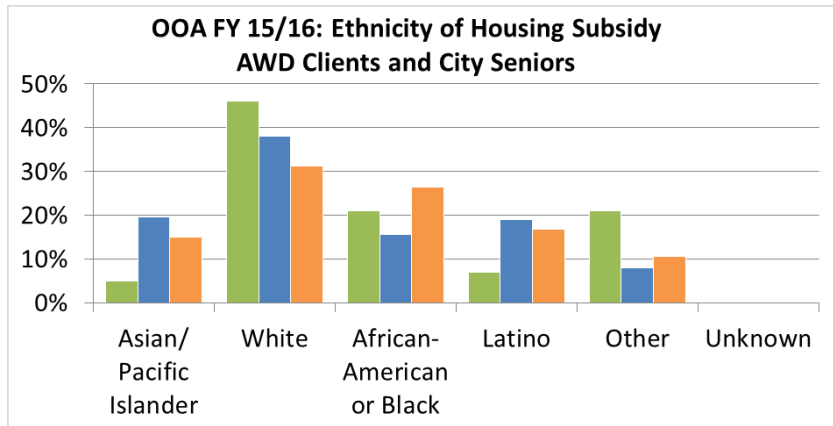
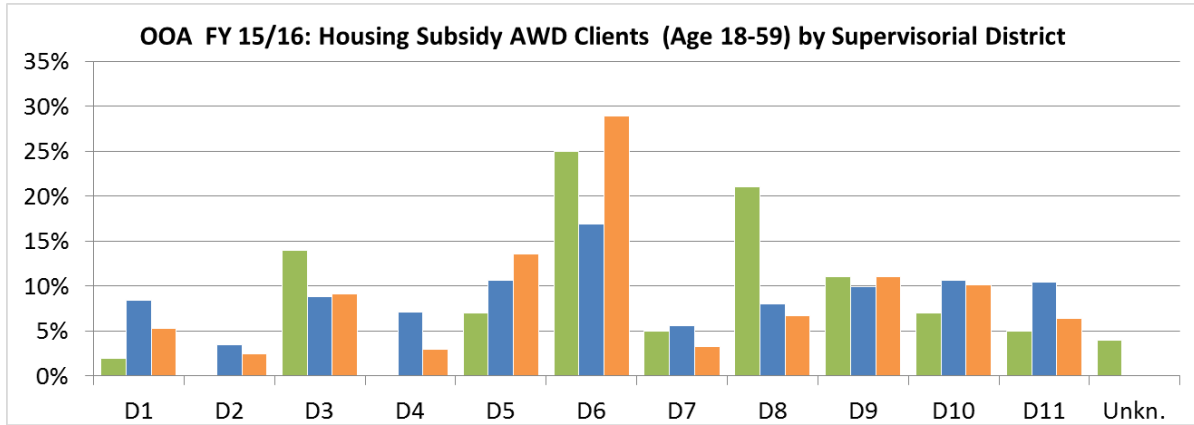

## HOUSING SUBSIDIES: SENIORS (AGE 60+)



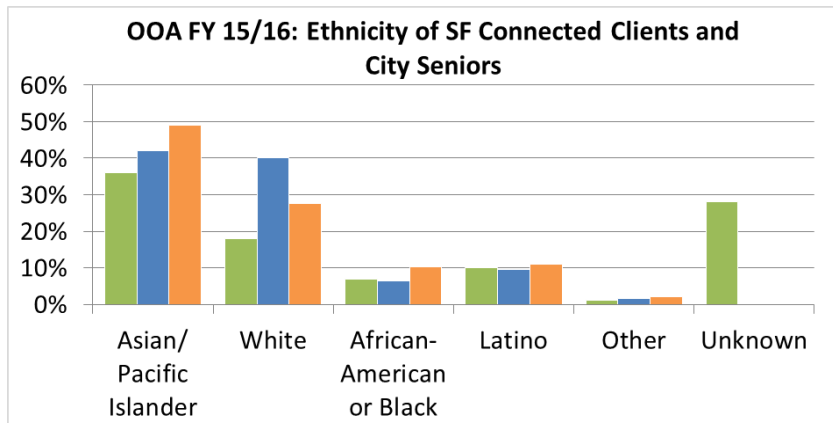
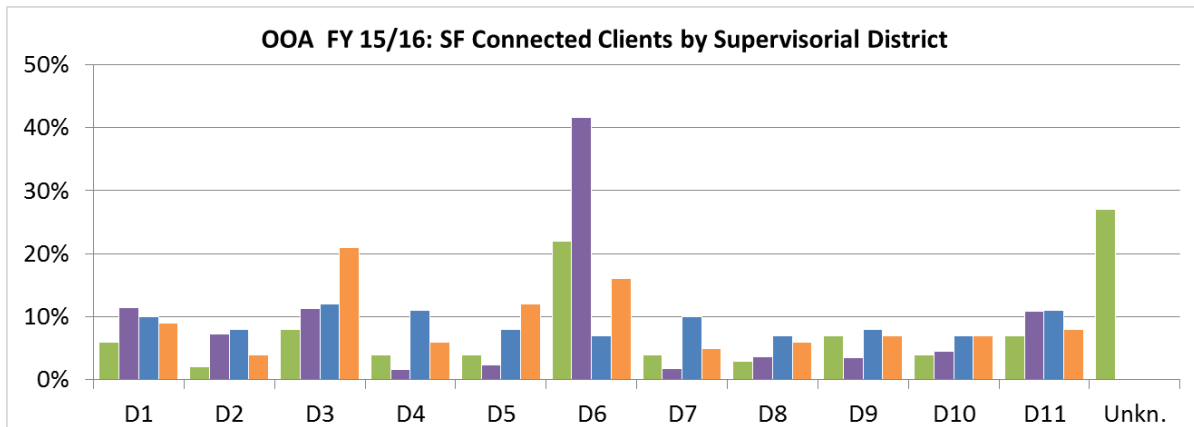
